

- Myanmar officially the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, also known as Burma (the official name until 1989)
- Total population : 55 Millions
- The country is called the "Golden Land," as it has many beautiful golden temples
- It is bordered by Bangladesh and India to its northwest, China to its northeast, Laos and Thailand to its east and southeast.
- The country's capital city is Nay Pyi Taw and its largest city is Yangon (formerly Rangoon)






Races

Traditional Dress: Myanmar's traditional dress includes the longyi, a sarong-like garment worn by both men and women. Women often wear a blouse called a "hta-mein" with their longyi. Thanaka, a cosmetic paste made from tree bark, is also applied to the face, particularly among women and children, for cosmetic and skin-care purposes.













Myanmar Coasting & Ports

- Myanmar, has a long coastline along the Bay of Bengal in the southwest.
- A total length of Myanmar coast is 2,228 km (1,260 nautical miles).
- Myanmar has total 9 ports, Of the nine ports along the coast, Yangon port is a major international port, handling more than 90 % of the country's normal exports and imports.
- Yangon (Thilawa), Dawei and Kyaukphyu ports are interconnected with Special Economic Zone.








Special Economic Zone

☐ Thilawa Special Economic Zone (SEZ):

 Thilawa Port: This SEZ is located south of Yangon and includes the Thilawa Port, which is a key industrial and trade hub. It has multiple berths for handling cargo.

☐ Dawei Special Economic Zone (SEZ):

 Dawei Port: Dawei SEZ is located in the Tanintharyi Region in the south of Myanmar. The Dawei Port is a significant part of this development project, and plans include the construction of a deep-sea port.



☐ Kyaukphyu Special Economic Zone (SEZ):

 Kyaukphyu Port: Kyaukphyu SEZ, located in the Rakhine State, includes the Kyaukphyu Port. This port is expected to be a crucial terminal for the China-Myanmar Economic Corridor project.



Yangon Port

- Yangon Port is Myanmar's largest and most significant international port.
- Yangon port has two harbour areas: Yangon Inner Harbour and Thilawa Outer Harbour.
- Importance: Yangon Port plays a pivotal role in Myanmar's trade and commerce, handling over 90% of the country's normal exports and imports. It serves as the primary gateway for goods coming into and leaving Myanmar.
- Yangon Port has 27 berths in the Inner Harbour, offering a total quay length of approximately 4,640 meters. These berths are used for loading and unloading vessels and handling cargo.
- The outer harbor (Thilawa) is located 25 Km down south of Yangon city and which is interconnected with SEZ.












